TRIBUTE TO MIR HADI ALI (LATE)

With profound respect and sincere gratitude, we honor the life and legacy of Mir Hadi Ali, a distinguished engineer, visionary leader, and steadfast advocate for the NED Alumni of Texas (NEDEAN). His enduring contributions to the engineering profession and to our alumni community continue to inspire generations of NEDians.

Academic and Professional Distinction

Mr. Hadi Ali's academic journey began at the NED University of Engineering and Technology, where he earned his Bachelor of Engineering in Civil Engineering (1972–1976). Committed to academic excellence, he went on to obtain a Master of Science in Structural Engineering from Imperial College London (1978–1979), one of the world's foremost institutions in the field. Over the course of his accomplished career, he held several leadership roles, including at Jacobs Engineering Group, where he played a pivotal role in the structural design of Klyde Warren Park in Dallas, a landmark project renowned for its innovative engineering. As President and Founder of Mir Consulting Engineers, LLC, he delivered impactful civil and structural engineering solutions across diverse sectors. Additionally, he supported early childhood education as the owner of The Goddard School of Prosper, contributing meaningfully to the local community.

Service to NEDEAN

Mr. Hadi Ali was a founding Board Member of NEDEAN and served with distinction as Chairman of the Board of Directors. His visionary leadership was instrumental in establishing the Endowment Fund at the University of Texas at Dallas (UTD), which supports talented students of NED or Pakistani origin. He also championed the Engineer in Training (EIT) program, offering structured, fully funded training to under-resourced engineering graduates, bridging the gap between academia and industry.

A Lasting Legacy

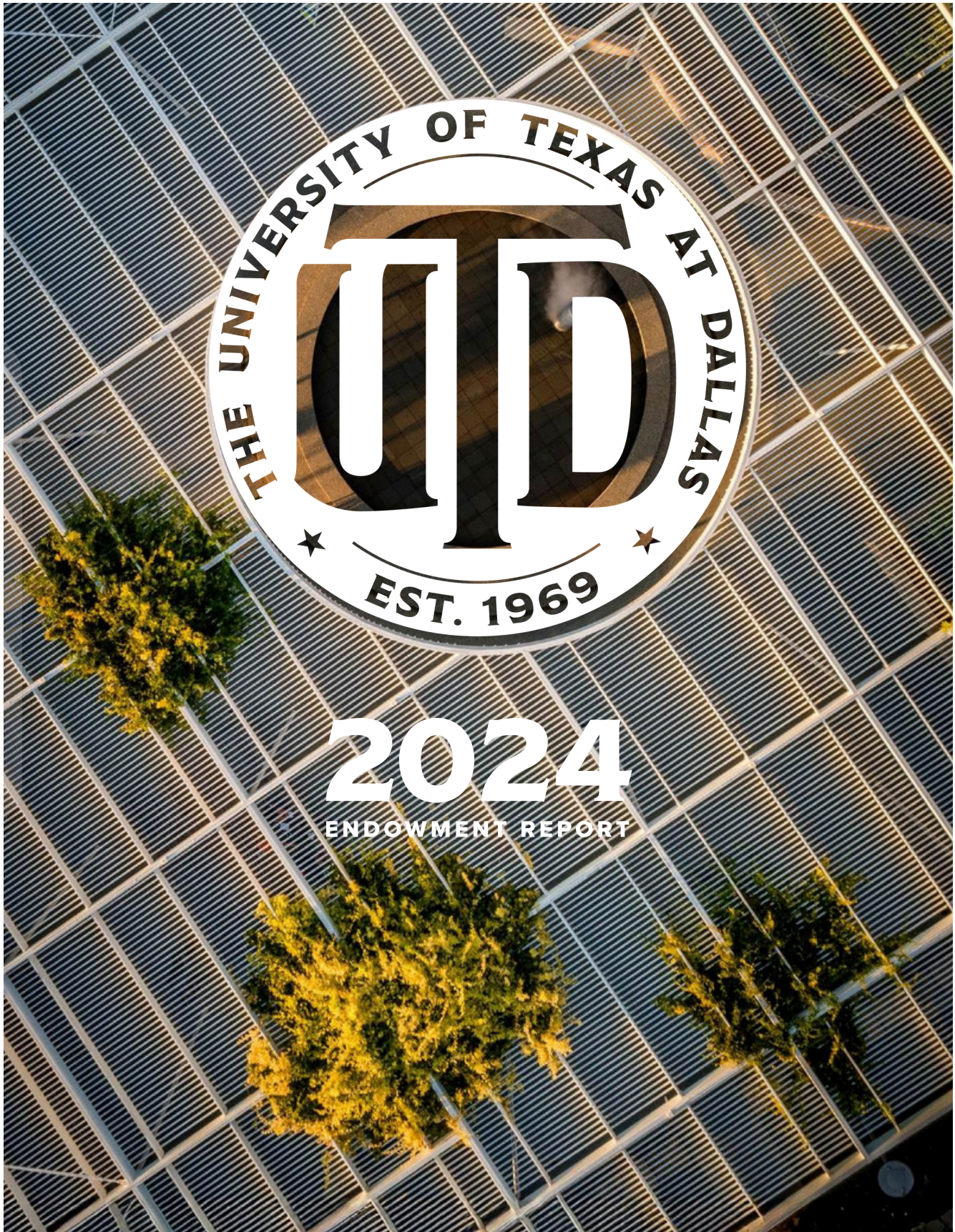

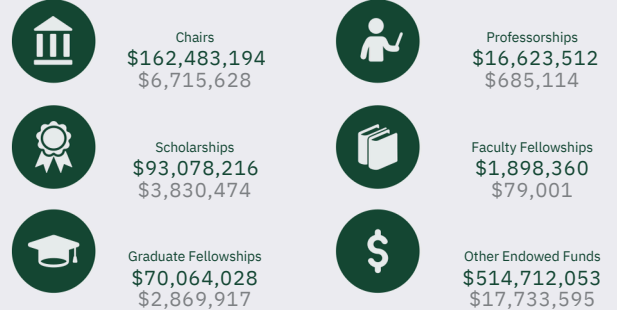

■ Market Value ■ Annual Distribution

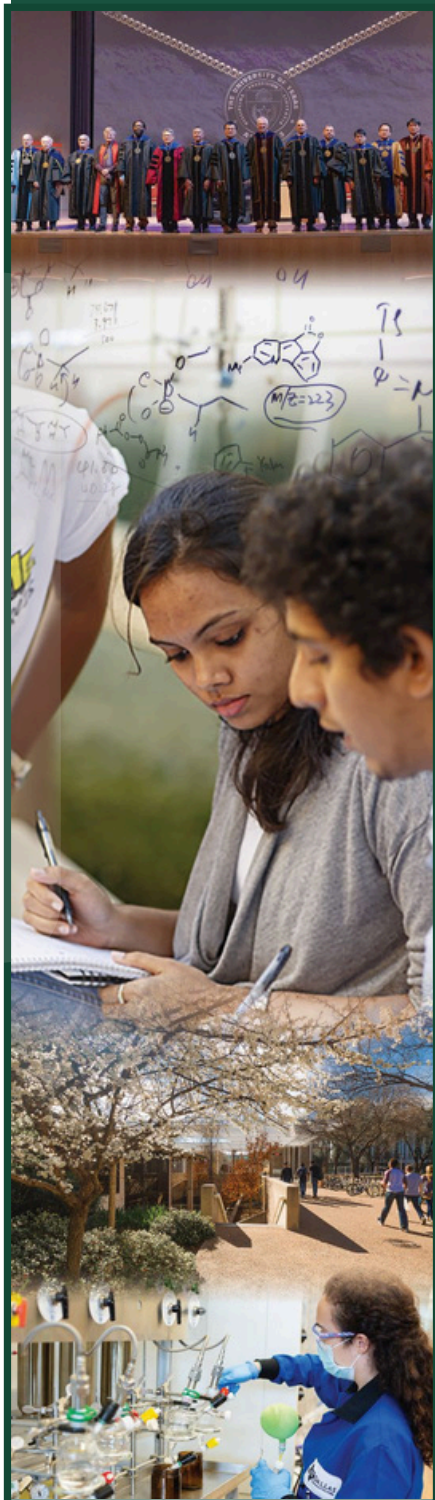

Endowment History and Purpose:

The Ashraf Habibullah N.E.D. Scholarship/Fellowship was established in 2019 for the benefit of The University of Texas at Dallas (UT Dallas). Funds distributed from this endowment shall be used to provide merit and need-based undergraduate scholarships and graduate fellowships to UT Dallas students. Among equally qualified applicants, preference will be given to an applicant who has completed all or part of his/her preparatory education in Pakistan; has a connection to Pakistan through his/her family, community or employment; or is an active member of the UT Dallas Pakistan Students Association.

Endowment Management Summary:

To ensure that endowment gifts to UT Dallas retain their value over time, The University of Texas System Board of Regents has retained The University of Texas Investment Management Company (UTIMCO), a private 501(c)(3) corporation, to manage the investment of endowment funds. Summary of Activity:

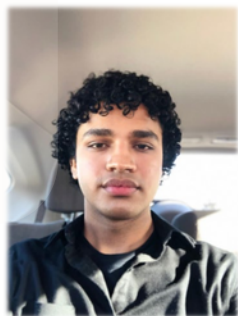

EIT (ENGINEER-IN-TRAINING) PROGRAM UPDATE

NEDEAN Engineer-in-Training (EIT) Program

The Engineer-in-Training (EIT) Sponsorship Program, launched by NEDEAN - NED Alumni of North Texas, is designed to support first-generation and low- to middle-income NED graduates in securing their first engineering roles through a six-month hands-on training program. Recognizing the challenges many new graduates face - particularly the lack of industry exposure and professional networks—this program places selected candidates in reputable engineering firms in Karachi. Each trainee receives a monthly stipend sponsored by NEDEAN, helping bridge the gap between academic learning and professional practice.

Program Origins and Challenges

This impactful initiative was the brainchild of our late board member, Mir Hadi Ali, who laid its foundation with the support of three batchmates based in Pakistan and two additional contributors from the U.S. Following his passing, the program faced a period of disruption. In response, the NEDEAN Board took decisive steps to revamp and strengthen the program with long-term sustainability in mind. Key measures included:

1. Establishing multiple layers of leadership to ensure program continuity
2. Organizing weekly virtual meetings between the U.S. and Pakistan teams
3. Maintaining detailed meeting minutes and actionable follow-ups
4. Developing standardized legal and communication templates, such as:
 - Introduction letters and MOUs for host companies
 - Candidate letters, sponsorship flyers, application forms, and appointment letter templates
5. Automating administrative processes to reduce paperwork and enhance matching between candidates and program criteria
6. Creating a transparent, legal method for transferring monthly funds from NEDEAN (U.S.) to host companies in Pakistan

These tasks were ambitious, but thanks to the commitment and collaboration of our dedicated team, we successfully streamlined the program for effective and sustainable implementation.

Our Donors

For 2025, our goal is to place at least 10 deserving graduates. At an estimated cost of \$1,200 per candidate, our total funding requirement is \$12,000. With generous support from our community, we have secured funding and pledges for 9-10 candidates. We sincerely thank our contributors:

- Ashraf Habibullah (CSI) - \$5,000
- Malik Sadiq – \$4,000
- Abbas Dadabhoy – \$2,500 (Pledged)
- Zahid Rasheed – \$550 (PKR 150,000)

We also extend our gratitude to Zahid Rasheed for generously providing his Karachi office for candidates' interviews and EIT-related coordination.

To date, we've successfully placed the following candidates with reputable firms:

 - Completed training; secured a full-time job at double her training stipend.
2. Aftab Ahmed
 - Recently started training with SMK Associates (Civil Engineering)
3. Wahab Khan
 - Scheduled to begin training with Exponent Engineers (Civil Engineering)

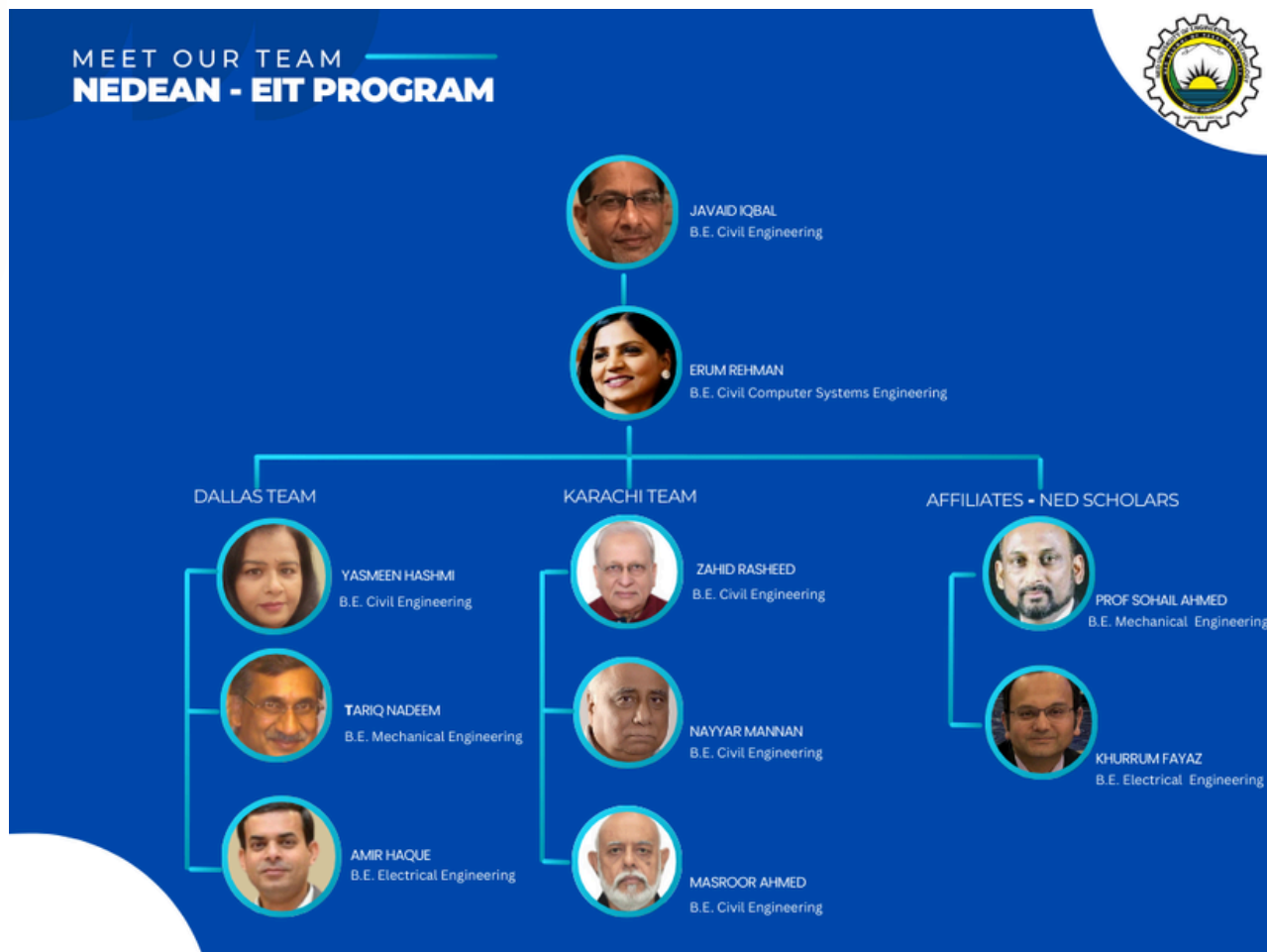


EIT (ENGINEER-IN-TRAINING) PROGRAM UPDATE

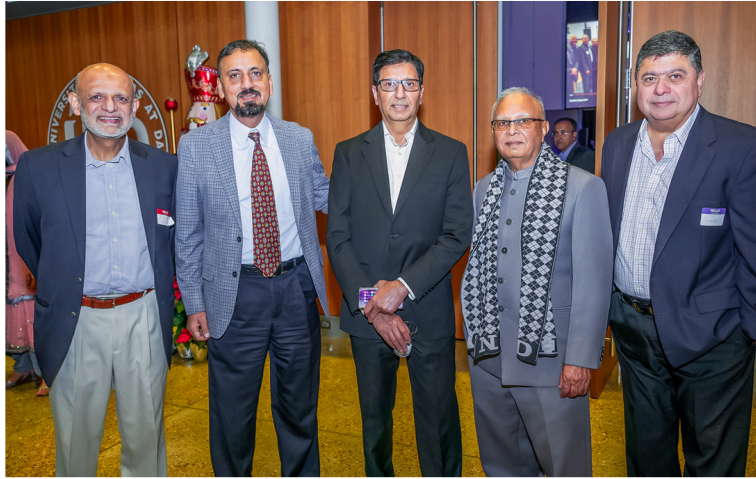

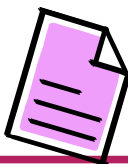
